Why?

Influencing the choices people make and their behaviours is critical to creating a safe work environment.

By understanding workers' underlying values, perceptions and beliefs (culture), as well as their personal experiences (climate), you can positively impact your safety performance.

How do you measure culture?

A survey is a great place to start.

icare has developed a 40-item survey in cooperation with Griffith University. It measures culture across seven dimensions that impact safety culture.

1. Organisational values
2. Management support
3. Co-worker support
4. Guidelines and procedures
5. Reporting systems
6. Safety climate
7. Job demands

What's involved?

The best results will be achieved if you are actively involved in the process.

We need you to be the communications champion at your workplace and get people excited and ready to participate.

We will help you to develop a delivery plan to ensure the survey is a success.

What will I get?

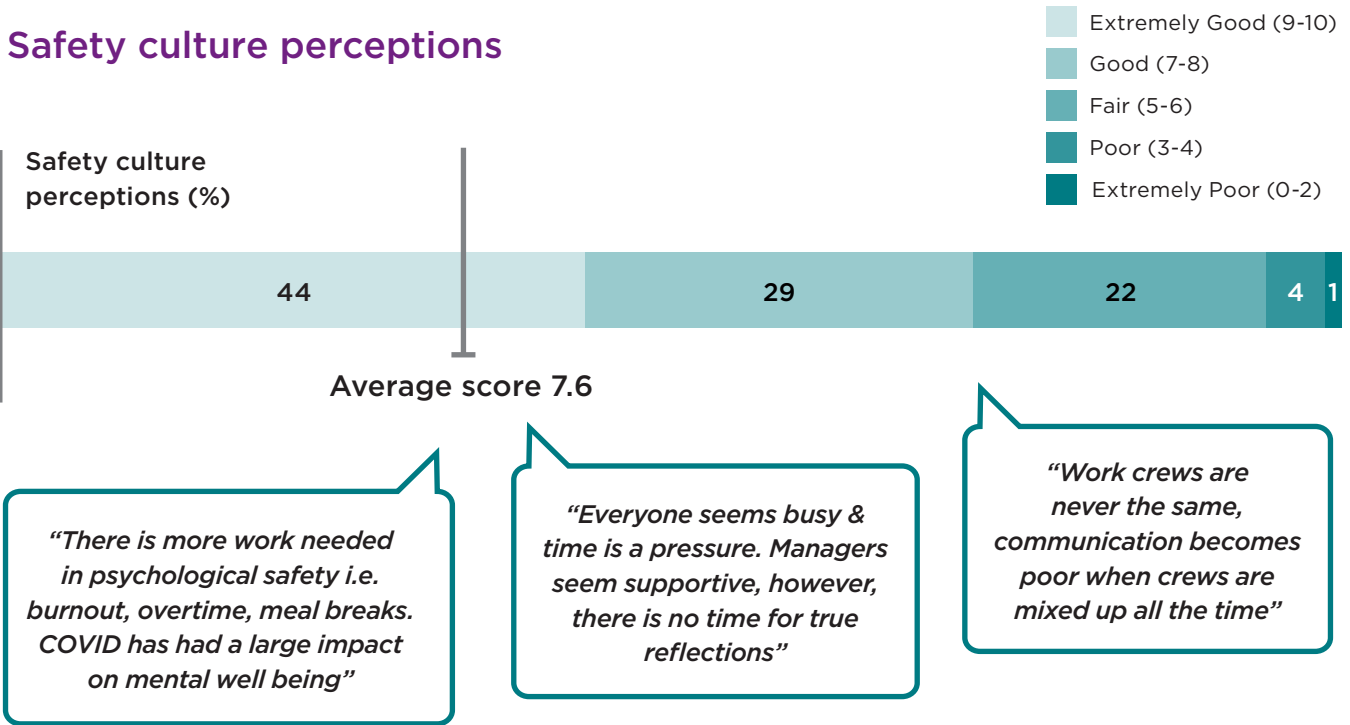
In addition to measuring culture across seven dimensions, the survey asks people for their ideas about what needs to change to improve safety and the safety culture.

You will get a confidential report with detailed ratings for each dimension. The report also provides insights about:

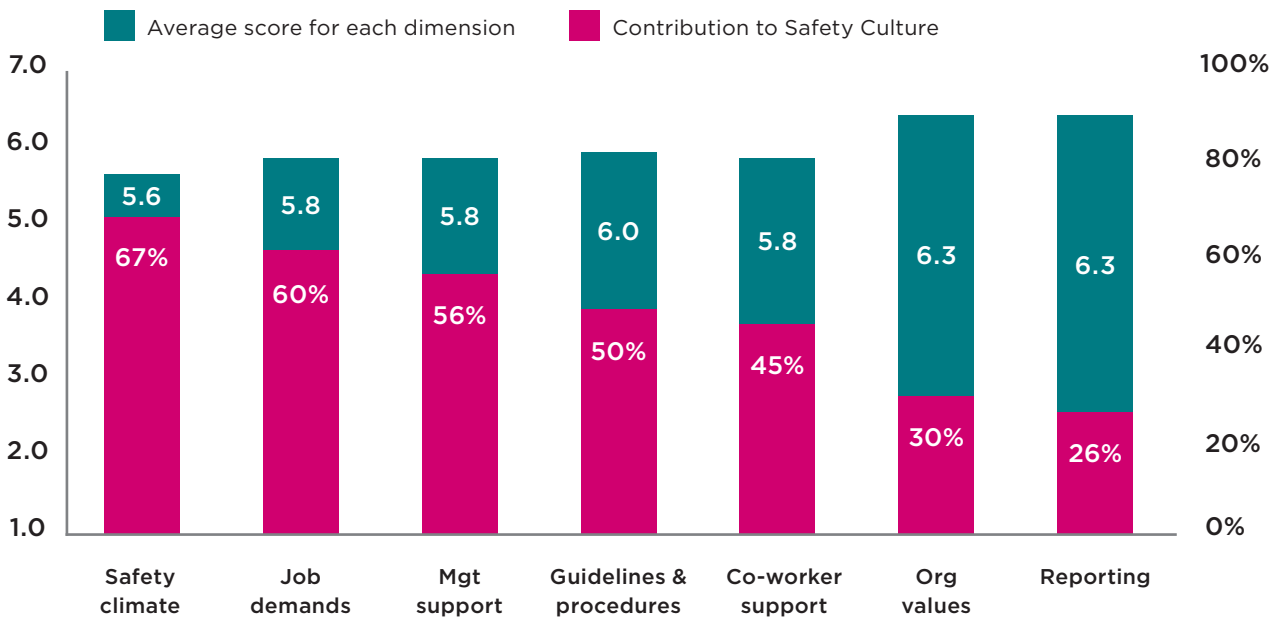
- what to focus on to enhance your overall health and wellbeing strategy; and
