Swisse hosted icare representative and Paralympic powerlifting champion Kahi Puru at its Botany branch to hear directly about how workplace accidents can have a life-altering impact - helping workers understand the power of keeping a strong focus on accident and injury-prevention.

"I've experienced first-hand how workplace injury can have a devastating effect on the individual and their loved ones, as well as on the workplace. By sharing my experience, I can make people more safety-aware. Being able to prevent one workplace injury is worth its weight in gold.

"Swisse's investment in its workers' health and safety through interactive learning sessions with icare is a signal that Swisse places workplace safety at the utmost importance of its company culture. It ensures workers are vigilant on the job - looking out for each other and working smarter through safer decision-making and work practices," Mr Puru said.

Swisse Wellness Director, Corporate & Strategy, George Livery said they were keen to address warehouse safety in a creative way, and collaborating with icare allowed them to deliver the message on workplace safety and returning to work with a strong focus on person-centric experiences of our Paralympians.
