Payment codes

The following is a list of general payment codes for treatment, rehabilitation and care services provided in the Lifetime Care and Support Scheme.

A payment code is represented by LTCS followed by a numerical code (e.g. LTCS999) for a corresponding treatment, rehabilitation or care service description in the following categories:

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Requesting treatment, rehabilitation and care services

Payment codes must be used on all requests for treatment, rehabilitation or care services submitted to **icare**. All request forms have a space for including payment codes. When completing requests, indicate the specific service that is to be provided and select the numerical payment code that **most closely** matches the service. Refer to the descriptions in this document for clarification. If you're unsure which code to use, contact the participant's coordinator.

Please note: The majority of request forms are now combined for **icare lifetime care** and the **icare workers care** program. If you're requesting services for workers in the workers care program, the payment codes are different. The payment codes for workers care are workers compensation payment codes. Refer to the invoicing and payment page on the icare website www.icare.nsw.gov.au for the workers care payment codes.

Invoices

Payment codes must be used on all invoices submitted to **icare**. Payment codes will be listed on the Certificate or Purchase Order issued when the service was approved. The payment codes included on invoices must match the approved services listed on the Certificate or Purchase Order. If they don't match those on the Certificate/Purchase Order, the invoice will be returned to the service provider or supplier.
